Maths

Year 1

Multiplication and Division - Count, read and write numbers to 100 in numerals; count in multiples of 2s, 5s and 10s. Solve one-step problems involving multiplication and division by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays.

Fractions - Recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity. Recognise, find and name a quarter as one of four equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.

Geometry - Describe position, direction and movement, including whole, half, quarter and three-quarter turns.

Year 2

Fractions - Recognise, find, name and write fractions 1/3, 1/4, 2/4 and 3/4 of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity.

Write simple fractions, for example 1/2 of 6 = 3 and recognise the equivalence of 2/4 and 1/2.

Time - Tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on a clockface to show these times. Know the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day.

History

The children will be learning about significant historical events, people and places within Devon. The lessons will cover Sir Francis Drake, Sir Francis Chichester, Kents Cavern and Dartmoor prison.




Computing -Creating Writing

The children will familiarise themselves with typing on a keyboard and begin using tools to change the look of their writing,

English

The books we will be basing our writing on this half-term are: Amelia Earhart by Izabel Sanchez Vegara and Could a Penguin Ride a Bike? by Camilla de la Bédoyère and Aleksei Bitskoff. The children will be writing a biography and creating fact files, about animals, to write a humorous page for a non-fiction book.





Music - Creatures of the River Dart

Creatures of the River Dart. A musical exploration of the fauna inhabiting the Dart and Dartmouth estuary (insect, fish and bird life).

Exploring musical texture, timbre, pulse and rhythm through manipulation of percussion instruments, interpreting pictures and movement through musical ideas slow, fast, shallow, deep, quiet, loud etc.

Creating our own simple songs with rhyming lyrics eg The Frog, The Buzzard, The Trout.

Science - Animals (including humans) - Year 1

The children will learn about five of the groups that scientists use to classify animals: mammals, fish, birds, reptiles and amphibians. They will learn to identify the group an animal belongs to by its features and will classify animals according to their group. Children will learn about the parts of the human body and have the opportunity to explore the five senses through a simple investigation.
